## Rosebud Podcast Episode 1 Transcript

This podcast may contain information that may not be suitable for all listeners. Listener discretion is advised. This investigation is ongoing. Information for this podcast was obtained through police interviews and reports, taken throughout the investigation by the Boynton Beach Police Department.

Welcome to Rosebud, the Victoria Rose Miller story. My name is Maxx-Anne Miller, the host for this podcast. This podcast is presented by the Boynton Beach Police Department. The topic of this podcast is the life and untimely death of Victoria Rose Miller.

It was May of 1996 when something terrible happened to Vicky. The mother of two had her life tragically cut short when someone brutally beaten, killed, and dumped her body behind the fraternal order of police lodge. Victoria Rose Miller was a mother, a sister, a daughter who didn't deserve her tragic end. She is much more than her death though. Her family and friends are still searching for who did this, while multiple investigators are puzzled. She was only wearing tennis shoes when she was found, and the criminals who committed this heinous crime have yet to be apprehended. That's where our listeners come in. We need you to help us catch Vicky's killer. There is someone that has to know something that happened to her. So look behind you, the murderer may be closer than you think.

The Boynton Beach Police Department's murder cases went from 1 in 1995 to 10 in 1996. This case being one of few from that year that remains unsolved amongst the police department. If you've heard anything about this case, please contact us. Our contact information is listed in the description and at the end of this episode. Vicky was last seen leaving a party new Bryant Park in Lake Worth Beach, formerly known as Lake Worth, on May 10, 1996. Her mother, Joann Miller, reported her missing on May 10, 1996, and her body was unfortunately found on May 11, 1996 in Boynton Beach FL. The medical examiner reported that she was most likely killed on May 10, 1996. While there have been many leads, there have been no answers as to who killed Vicky and how she'd end up in Boynton Beach. But there is much more to Vicky than her tragic end. While Vicky's life was short, there were plenty of twists and turns in her life before she was murdered. While her case and investigation is alive, she is not here to tell her story. It is important to understand why her life is as important as her death, because it may hold the clues as to who killed her.

Victoria Rose Miller was born on July 28, 1977 in the State of Florida. She had an older brother and sister, as well as three younger sisters. She went by Vicky, Rose, and Tori by friends and family. Vicky had a seemingly normal childhood. Vicky's sister, Melissa, was born a little less than a year after Vicky was born. Vicky and Melissa were extremely close. The family often took vacations and traveled to Disney frequently. Vicky's mother, Joann was very loving and her father Roy, was very supportive. Vicky had a great childhood that would support a healthy lifestyle. Vicky's sisters, Sarah and Alexis, were welcomed into the family when Vicky turned

between the ages of 9 and 11. While there were a lot of women in the house, Roy truly cherished all of his daughters and was an amazing father.

After Vicky's death, the family was broken. The stress of Vicky's murder contributed to the death of Joann, who died in 1988 from cervical cancer. Vicky's sister Melissa, also grieved deeply after the loss of her sister and her mother and died shortly after Joann in a car accident. Within three years, Roy Miller's wife and two of his daughters had passed away, and he was left to raise two young girls on his own. Roy later passed away in 2004 after an accident involving a two-seated aircraft. Within the time span of eight years, the two youngest Miller daughters (both in their late teens) were left without most of their core family.

This crime had such a large impact on the family, and it's hard to think what would've happened if Vicky was never killed. Vicky's family started off completely fine and normal, free from any toxicity. The seemingly perfect family was in shambles after Vicky's death, and no one could have predicted that. The destruction is unimaginable to most but was a cruel reality to Sarah and Alexis.

Once Vicky got into her early teens, things started to change. Stay tuned for the next episode where we talk about when problems began to arise in Vicky and her family. Vicky was a blonde hair, blue-eyed 18-year old who weighed approximately 125 pounds and was 5'7 at the time of her death.
